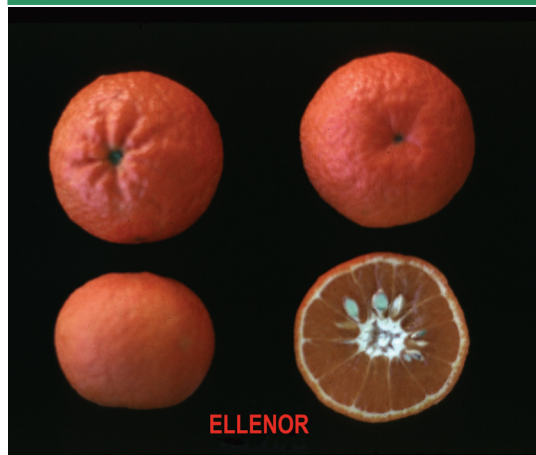


## mandarin variety fact sheet



# Ellenor

### Origin

QDPI, Queensland: an Ellendale X Thorny hybrid produced in 1940s. Sometimes called 'Hillary White'.

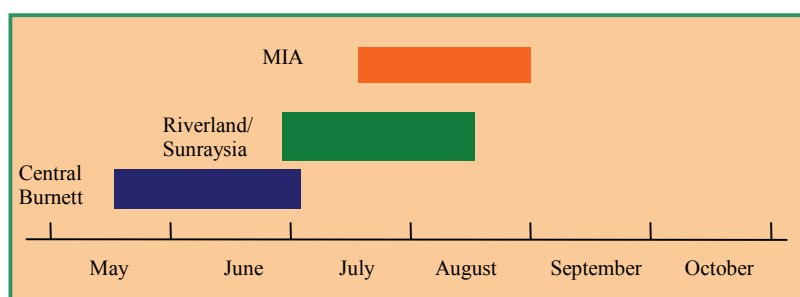
### Type

Mid season easy-peel.

### Market

Fresh, domestic

### Marketing season (estimated)



### Internal quality

Very good eating quality, with high juice content. The internal flesh is red in colour. Seed numbers are high at around 17 seeds per fruit. There is seldom any evidence of granulation in this variety.

### External quality

Skin texture is coarse. The skin is relatively thick (6mm) and moderately difficult to peel. The external colour is deep red and is little effected by sunburn.

### Postharvest performance

Fruit can be plucked but are generally clipped. The peel is firm which aids harvesting and postharvest handling/storage.

### Field performance

The tree is vigorous with an open growth habit.

### Pest and disease

The variety is susceptible to Emperor Brown Spot (Alternaria), which can cause serious problems in some seasons, particularly in humid areas near the coast.

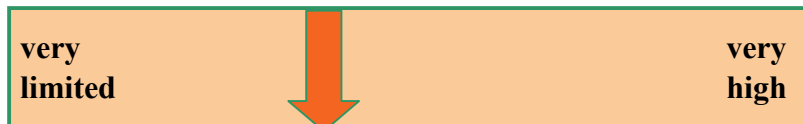

## Extent of plantings

Commercial: Approx 10,000 trees, with half non-bearing, almost all located in Qld.

Research: Research agency arboreta.

## State of knowledge



The coarse skin texture, and high seed number are perhaps the major limits to the commercial expansion of this variety.
